SAFETY

NET PAYLOAD FOR YOUR BASE RACK

The net payload for your BASE RACK is calculated by subtracting the weight of the BASE RACK and the vehicle mounting kit from the vehicle's roof capacity.

The vehicle's roof load capacity may vary between models and driving conditions. Refer to vehicle owner's manual for model and condition specific roof load capacities.

Air Deflector should be fitted to the BASE RACK. Instructions are in the following pages.

When using a BASE RACK Light Bar (part number 1780500):

It is recommended to fit the Light Bar in front of the BASE RACK, together with the Air Deflector, which will need to be trimmed.

The Light Bar can also be fitted above the rack, but will not fit underneath.



BEFORE STARTING, READ ALL STEPS OF THE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY AND CHECK ALL PART

STEP 1: REMOVE FACTORY ROOF BARS (IF FITTED)




1. Remove covers

Using a panel remover, unclip the base of the cap (two clips on each side).



2. Remove roof bars

Unscrew bolts on each side & remove roof bars.




3. Clean up

Remove all dirt, silicone & double-sided tape that might cover the anchor point areas.



4. Spread a small amount of sealant around the anchor points.



5. Assemble mount brackets


- -Place rubber packers over each set of anchor points.
- -Position mounting brackets following the mount brackets diagram, so that weld nuts are facing towards the centre of the vehicle.
- -Attach each bracket to the roof mounting points using M8 Button head screws and M8 Bonded washers (See image).
- -Tighten screws to specified torque



Torque M8 to 22Nm




6. Clean up excess sealant on inside of van, if accessible.



7. Using a tape measure, measure across the vehicle between the middle of the hole on the outside face of the front and rear set of mounting brackets. Make a note of each measurement.

STEP 3 – ASSEMBLE BASE RACK WITH BLADE BRACKETS




8. Place the BASE RACK halves face down on a clean flat surface. Provide protection to the top face of BASE RACK to avoid marking of surfaces




9. Assemble the two halves of the BASE RACK.




10. Check the position of the mounting plates (circled in image) on the blade brackets in relation to the channels on the BASE RACK.

Align Blade bracket split with BASE RACK split.







11. Insert 2, M8 x 20 Studs into each of the Stud Plates as shown.



12. Insert the assembled stud plates into the correct BASE RACK channels. Rotate the plates 90 degrees.







13. Flip the blade brackets over so they are upside down and carefully place on top of the BASE RACK. Ensure the M8 studs go through the slots.

Secure the blade brackets to the BASE RACK using M8 flat washers and nyloc nuts.


Do not fully tighten, allowing each blade to move.





14. At the split, add a blade joiner on top of the Blade brackets, then secure blades and joiner to the BASE RACK using M8 flat washers and nyloc nuts.


Do not fully tighten, allowing each blade to move.



15. Fasten the side of the blade joiners to the side of each half blade bracket using M6x16 button head screws, M6 flat washers and nyloc nuts.

Tighten M6 screws to specified torque.





16. Using the previously recorded measurements, adjust the location of the blade bracket on the BASE RACK.

Ensure the distance between the blade bracket and the edge of the tray is the same on both sides.

Fully tighten all M8 Nyloc nuts.




STEP 4 - OPTIONAL: ASSEMBLE LIGHTBAR

If fitting a BASE RACK Light Bar in front of the rack, the Air Deflector will need to be modified.

Modification depends on Light Bar position, which itself depends on assembly configuration (Barn doors or Tailgate) and position & type of antenna (varies with vehicle models & year of release).

Note: Light bar can be fitted above the rack (no modification of the Air Deflector needed), but will not fit beneath.



17. Install Light Bar with extended (forward) brackets mounted inward.

Roughly offset Light Bar away from antenna.






18. Install cage nuts in location shown.

Then SKIP STEP 5.


Air Deflector modifications and assembly will take place after BASE RACK installation to roof (after step 6).

STEP 5 – ASSEMBLE AIR DEFLECTOR (without Light Bar)




Note: Easier with BASE RACK upside down. Vehicle mount brackets should be fitted.


19. Lay the air deflector face down, parallel with the front of the BASE RACK. This will help determine the general position for the stud plates. Ensure the distance between the end of the deflector and outside of the tray is the same on both sides.



20. Insert one M8 x 20 Stud into each of the Stud Plates as shown.




21. Flip the plate over and insert each of the 4 assembled stud plates into the front channel of the BASE RACK.
Rotate 90 degrees and ensure the axis of the bolt lines up with the holes in the air deflector.



22. Attach the air deflector mounting slots to the stud plates with an M8 flat washer & nyloc nut.

Ensure the folded ends of the deflector are outside the ends of the blade brackets.

Leave nut loose enough to allow assembly to slide along channel.



23. Install cage nut in location shown.

Place the large M6 washer (4581082) between the blade and the air deflector (You can use tape to hold the washer in place) and secure using the remaining M6 Button head screws and small M6 washers (4584329), as shown.

24. Tighten all screws to specified torque.



Torque M8 to 22Nm




Torque M6 to 9Nm

STEP 6 – ASSEMBLE BASE RACK TO ROOF




25. With assistance, carefully place the BASE RACK on the vehicle so the inside of the blade brackets rests on the outside of the mounting brackets. The entire BASE RACK assembly should be clear of the vehicle roof. All mounting holes/slots should align closely.

Note: Place protective material on roof to reduce the risk of accidental damage to vehicle.






26. Confirm BASE RACK is correctly aligned to vehicle. If it is not, it is recommended to remove the BASE RACK from the vehicle roof and repeat the mounting process from the measurement step.



27. Use the M8 Button head Torx screws and M8 Black washers to secure the roof tray to the roof mounting brackets. Tighten all screws to the specified torque.






28. **If necessary**, loosen back mount brackets to realign them with the blade brackets.

Retighten screws to the specified torque.







OPTIONAL: WITH LIGHT BAR STEP 7 – MODIFY & ASSEMBLE AIR DEFLECTOR



- 29. Move Light Bar in position:
 - -Centered if it fits.
 - -Offset from antenna if needed.
 - (~10mm from bracket to antenna)
- 30. Place the Air Deflector on top of the BASE RACK. Make sure it is centered.
- 31. From the outside of the Light Bar brackets, add **5mm** and mark the Air Deflector.

Distance between marks should be 970mm.





- 32.-Cut the air deflector vertically **at marks from previous step.**
 - -Discard the central part of the Air Deflector.
 - -Remove any sharp edges and paint raw edges with black touch-up paint.

33. While leaving the BASE RACK on the roof of the vehicle, **FOLLOW STEP 5** and fasten the two Air Deflector halves to the BASE RACK.
